#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

### **Socioeconomic and Geopolitical events:**

There are four major periods indicated for October--

October 1 - 3 **An Ending**. Risk aversion is high. Focus on global economy and stability. Geopolitical issues.

October 4 - 12 **A New Start**. Global leaders focused on calming things down and restabilizing the global system. U.S.. government searches for common ground between various groups in dialogue and negotiations.

October 13 - 18 **A Glitch.** Discussions and negotiations may break down. There's an increased risk of protests, terrorist activity, and "random acts' of violence.

October 19 - 31. **Trigger Point.** Increasing instability. People may be displaying irrational or panic behavior. Global leaders are putting high level plans into action.

#### **Global natural events:**

October 1-11 **Hot, Active.** High energy in the system may enhance storms and flooding. Increased risk of volcanic activity.

October 12 - 18 Windy, Stormy.


October 19 - 31 Unstable. Increased risk of moderate earthquakes...

#### **OCTOBER 2011**



**Global System – Delusional, in Denial, and Irrational.** Global stability sits on a knife edge; the era of growth has passed. Yet, world leaders are in denial of the gravity of the situation.

(Mood factors: NW+, SW, W+, N, E-)



**Human Societies – Aggressive, Protective.** People are more willing to fight for what they believe in. Leaders or leadership may emerge from among the people.

(Mood factors: SW+, NE-, W+, S, E-)



## U.S. Government – Dialogue, Debate and Confusion.

Everyone has an idea, but there is little overall direction. There may be conciliatory gestures, but conclusive decisions may be difficult.

(Mood factors: NE+, SE, NW-, E+, W-)




**Nature – Hidden, Sick, and Destructive**. Nature is primarily in the background, although it may be associated with sickness, injury, and/or destruction. There is a higher risk for earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, and/or disease outbreaks.

(Mood factors: SW+, NE-, W+, E-)


**In the stock market,** there may be a pause in the decline after a grand finale. This should be followed by a countertrend move. Note: the forecast after the first week may be inverted, as often occurs during countertrend markets (dashed line is an alternative forecast).



The above chart displays the output of a model that converts the values and relationships of the Moodlines on page 6 into a stock market forecast.








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

## Nature's Mood Cycles (from Human Perspective)




### Nature's Mood Cycles - Elemental View



## Factors (percent) Contributing to the Price of Crude Oil




## **Currency:** Currency markets may be volatile, but without clear direction. Perception of U.S. Dollar => Change per Week




## **Tracking MoodCompass Performance**

One of the best objective measures of the oscillations of social mood is the stock market. The stock market goes up and down with *expectations* of how well (or bad) things will be in the near future, and there is an abundance of minute by minute data. The chart below compares the output of a model generated from published *Moodlines* with actual weekly S&P closing prices (data from Google Finance).




## **About MoodCompass**

The MoodCompass profiles an entity based on the relative presence of four primary characteristics or of four hybrid characteristics. A profile expressed in terms of primary characteristics weighs the entity's relative focus on identity (north), focus on activity (south), use of intuition (west), and use of logic (east). A profile expressed in terms of hybrid characteristics weighs the entity's relative amount of nurturing behavior (northeast), directing behavior (southwest), manic expression (southeast), and somber expression (northwest). It was named the MoodCompass because the eight characteristics are best viewed in circular relation to one another like points on a compass:



The two sets of characteristics are inter-related. Each characteristic is a combination of the two that surround it. This relationship can be viewed by embedding a pie chart of the primary characteristics inside a pie chart of the hybrid characteristics: For example, the primary characteristic (W) Intuitive Processing is a combination of the two hybrid characteristics (SW) Directing and (NW) Somber. Likewise, the hybrid characteristic (NE) Nurturing is a combination of (N) Identity Focused and (E) Logic Processing.
